Volunteers Make An Impact!

Academic Support:

4,310 students received ongoing, structured tutoring and/or after-school programming and 5,525 were engaged in enrichment activities

Youth Service:

5,174 youth engaged in service to their communities

School Engagement:

81,732 hours of service were provided by community volunteers to the Atlanta Public School system

School Projects:

89 schools, attended by about 52,400 students, were physically improved

Community Improvements:

210 neighborhoods and community-based agencies were restored or cleaned

Home Repair & Improvements:

102 homes of senior citizens received repairs or general improvements

Technology Enrichment:

1,196 individuals benefited from skills training or received equipment

Aid & Companionship:

1,534 seniors & 1,760 chronically ill individuals were supported

Assistance & Support:

8,228 individuals and families received assistance, including 5,360 that received clothes, toys, and/or food and 2,868 that received employment, tax, and other personalized assistance

Disaster Relief:

5,602 evacuee families were assisted (including 302 matched with volunteer HOA case managers)

Meal Distribution:

110,627 meals were prepared, served, or delivered to individuals in need

Animals:

1,859 animals received care

Environmental Conservation:

1,430 acres of land were preserved or landscaped

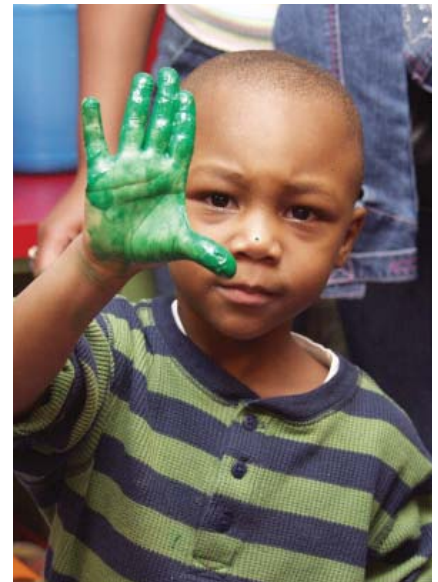
Hands On Atlanta volunteer accomplishments 2006



Hands On Atlanta volunteers have contributed **5,141,455** hours of service to the community and completed **1,025,261** volunteer opportunities since the founding of the organization in 1989.

During the past year, Hands On Atlanta:

- Organized 18,287 community service projects benefiting 575 community and non-profit agencies, including 112 public schools.
- Connected volunteers with 126,461 opportunities to serve in the community.
- Delivered 562,096 volunteer service* hours, for an estimated value of \$10,145,833 in volunteer labor.
- Involved 14,000 volunteers in 56,160 hours of service to the community during Hands On Atlanta Day.
- Engaged over 9,000 volunteers in service projects and community-based workshops during the Martin Luther King, Jr. Service Summit. They contributed over 25,000 service hours to the community.
- Engaged 4,697 youth volunteers who contributed 18,788 hours to the community during the National and Global Youth Service Day.
